## Who is EBECSA?

EBECSA is all of us who contribute to the best of our ability through payroll deduction to "Electric Boat Employees' Community Services Association." EBECSA is administered by a committee composed of Salary and Union contributing employees.

The administrative committee has employee representatives from the Marine Draftsmen's Association, from the Metal Trades Council, United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America, from the Management Club and other appointed salaried members.



## Employees Helping

The Electric Boat Employees' Community Services Association was formed in 1951. Funds collected through employee payroll deduction are carefully allocated to approved non-profit health and social service agencies. Emergency loans and assistance are also available to Electric Boat contributing employees in serious financial need. The Community Services Emergency Fund is administered by a United Way Community Services staff member.

## Contributions

Electric Boat and United Way have a strong relationship. Together, contributions made by Electric Boat as a corporation and by 54% of EB employees through the EBECSA combine to make Electric Boat the #1 employee contributor to the local United Way's annual campaign. Electric Boat also supports United Way by loaning EB employees to assist United Way during their busy campaign season. EB employees volunteer on numerous United Way committees and on the boards of member agencies. Members of our labor unions are strong supporters of the Gemma E. Moran United Way/Labor Food Center. In 2023, 477 EB employees pledged at the "Spinnaker" level by giving more than \$1,000 annually through payroll deduction to EBECSA.
