The Electric Boat Employees' Community Services Association was formed in 1951. Funds collected through employee payroll deduction are carefully allocated to approved non-profit health and social service agencies. Emergency loans and assistance are also available to Electric Boat contributing employees in serious financial need. The Community Services Emergency Fund is administered by a United Way Community Services staff member.

Electric Boat and United Way have a strong relationship. Together, contributions made by Electric Boat as a corporation and by 54% of EB employees through the EBECSA combine to make Electric Boat the #1 employee contributor to the local United Way's annual campaign. Electric Boat also supports United Way by loaning EB employees to assist United Way during their busy campaign season. EB employees volunteer on numerous United Way committees and on the boards of member agencies. Members of our labor unions are strong supporters of the Gemma E. Moran United Way/Labor Food Center. In 2023, 477 EB employees pledged at the "Spinnaker" level by giving more than \$1,000 annually through payroll deduction to EBECSA.
